New Boat Launch Permit Kiosk:

Our new kiosk is up and running at the boat launch. The machine is easy to use, accepts cards, and issues a sticker all in one transaction! Launch permits may also be purchased online at *www.cityof montague.org* or in-person at City Hall. Resident and Senior discounts only available online or at City Hall



Brush Pick Up Schedule:

The City of Montague will offer brush pick up the **week of May 22nd**. Materials must be placed roadside before Sunday, May 21st, as only one trip will be made through the City. All materials must be placed near the edge of the street and **should not be more than four feet (4') long and four inches (4") in diameter**. **No** stumps, branches, or logs created by property owners removing mature trees will be collected. In addition, **no** materials created by commercial trimming, building / construction materials, or other debris will be collected. Brush can also be brought to the White Lake Area Solid Waste Authority, 2100 Holton-Whitehall Rd., and disposed of according to their fee schedule.

4th of July Fireworks & Parade:

A beloved tradition is back: fireworks will be held on Tuesday, July 4th, this year! Securing the fireworks on the 4th has been a combined effort of local residents and business owners, forming the White Lake Fireworks Committee. The cities of Montague and Whitehall contributed equally to the cost. Fireworks will be held at dusk and the White Lake Area Chamber of Commerce 4th of July Parade will take place at 2 p.m. on the holiday.



Montague Pride Days/Free Dump Coupon:

The free dump coupon, used at the Solid Waste Authority at 2100 Holton-Whitehall Rd., has been postponed this year. Information on the new date will be posted as soon as available.

Dog Licensing:

Short & Long Term Rentals:



Special Election, May 2nd, 2023:

There will be a county-wide election May 2nd, 2023 for the Muskegon Area Intermediate School District (MAISD). If you are a registered voter in the City and would like to vote by mail, stop by City Hall for an Absentee Voter (AV) Application **or** submit one online at **https://www.michigan.gov/sos/**. City residents on the Permanent AV Application list have already been sent an application in the mail, which includes an option to be on the Permanent AV Ballot list per the recently passed Proposal 2-22. Another new feature of Proposal 2-22: the application was sent with an addressed and prepaid return envelope. Applications can be submitted to the City Clerk via drop-box, mail, or email at clerk@cityofmontague.org. In-person voting will proceed as usual in the City Council Room the day of the election from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.



Prescription Disposal:
