Brush Pick Up: The City of Montague will offer brush pick up the week of October 16th. Materials must be placed roadside by Sunday, October 15th as only one trip will be made through the City. Residents may place their brush near the edge of the street the week prior to being picked up. Brush should not be more than four (4) inches in diameter — NO STUMPS, BRANCHES, or LOGS. No materials generated by, construction activities, commercial trimming, or tree removal will be collected. After this date, residents can dispose of brush at the White Lake Area Solid Waste Authority, 2100 Holton-Whitehall Road.

The DDA held a Sculptural Kiosk contest this past spring for two artisan-created informational kiosks for the downtown. Thank you to the winners of the contest, Stephen Niezgoda and Creed McPherson of Sunset Artisans, for their beautiful designs. The new kiosks are located on the northeast corner of Ferry and Dowling Streets and at the Artisan Market Village on Water Street. The DDA is holding another contest through the end of September for the naming of the new social district and public space in the alley that runs between Dowling and Spring Streets. Check out the details at **www.cityofmontague.org!** The DDA also provided funding for improvements to the brick exteriors of the buildings on the east side of Ferry Street. These much-needed improvements keep our downtown looking beautiful!

Buttermilk Creek Park, located downtown on the north side of Dowling Hill, also received an upgrade over the summer via grant funds awarded by the National Environmental Education Foundation (NEEF) and Toyota America. Buttermilk Creek Park features a greenspace for sports in the summer that doubles as an ice skating rink in the winter, a warming shed, firepit, picnic tables, and now an accessible nature trail! The grand opening for the Buttermilk Creek Park Nature Trail will take place on Saturday, September 23rd at 1 p.m.





Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety: In an effort to promote a more walkable and cyclable City, yield-to-pedestrian signs and solar-powered pedestrian crossing signals have become a frequent sight around town. Yielding to pedestrians in a designated crosswalk, on foot or bicycle, is state law and is enforced within the City. **Pedestrians also have a responsibility at these crossings. Individuals should not automatically enter the crosswalk, but also yield to cars and only proceed if a vehicle has sufficient time to brake and yield. A helpful safety tip: always make eye contact with an individual driver to be sure they intend to stop before proceeding.**

Montague Farmers Market & Artisan Market Village: The Farmers Market and Artisan Market Village both had a successful summer season and remain open on Saturdays throughout September and October, from 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Both will be open for Pumpkinfest on Saturday, October 14th. The City of Montague is continuing to facilitate food assistance programs (Bridge / P-EBT Cards and Double UP Food Bucks) in exchange for tokens at the market. We are pleased that the program has helped local patrons double their purchasing power for produce from local farmers and vendors who are participating through the Montague Farmers Market. Senior Coupons for the Montague Farmers Market made their debut this season and were very popular with senior residents in the participating municipalities of City of Montague, Whitehall Township, and Fruitland Township. The funds for this program were made available through Senior Millage monies allocated to each municipality in the county. Stay tuned for more information on this program for the 2024 market season. A big thank you to all the local vendors and patrons for making the Montague Farmers Market and Artisan Market Village the place to be all season long!

November General Election: The General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 7th. Items on the ballot include the mayoral seat, three Council seats, and a millage for Montague Area Public Schools. Voters can register to vote or sign up for an Absentee Ballot with the City Clerk during regular business hours or online with the Secretary of State at: *Michigan.gov/VOTE*. In-person voting takes place November 7th, in the lower-level of City Hall in the Council Chambers, from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Election Day. Pre-election weekend hours will be held Sunday, November 5th from 6 a.m. to 2 p.m.
